

Cary Gray Elected to Baylor University Board of Regents

<u>Baylor University</u> announced it had confirmed <u>Cary Gray</u>, President and Managing Director of Gray Reed & McGraw, as the newest member of its Board of Regents. Gray will serve a three-year term that begins tomorrow, June 1st.

Regents are selected by election, with 75% of the membership elected by the Regents themselves and 25% elected by the Baptist General Convention of Texas. Regents serve a three-year term, and may serve up to three terms consecutively before they must rotate off the Board for at least one year.
