Although many companies believe that their employees would never pay bribes, agents and representatives that are affiliated with your company can pay bribes, which will affect both you and your company. Recent prosecutions have also shown that no industry is immune from prosecution; even companies in traditionally "low-risk" industries are being prosecuted.
