In re Syngenta Lawsuits Claims and Defenses

- Plaintiffs generally alleged that Syngenta prematurely commercialized and otherwise inappropriately marketed and sold Agrisure Viptera and/or Agrisure Duracade corn seed, causing contamination of the United States corn supply and significant disruption to the export of United States corn and corn products.
- Syngenta denied any and all claims and asserted various defenses which it believed to be meritorious.

In re Syngenta Lawsuits Settlement Summary

- Total Settlement Amount (the "Settlement Funds"): \$1.51 billion
- <u>Class Definition</u>: "Any Person in the United States that during the Class Period owned any Interest in Corn in the United States priced for sale during the Class Period (September 15, 2013 through April 10, 2018)," who fall into one of four Subclasses
 - Subclass 1, Producers who did not purchase Viptera or Durcade
 - Subclass 2, Producers who purchased Viptera or Duracade
 - Subclass 3, Grain Handling Facilities
 - Subclass 4, Ethanol Plants
- Excluded Exporters: Cargill, ADM, Dreyfus, Bunge, TransCoastal, Agribase, Gavilon, DeLong
- Class Period: September 15, 2013 through April 10, 2018
- <u>Settlement Administrator</u>: Brown Greer
- Subclasses 1 and 2: Estimated to exceed 600,000 and include owners, operators, landlords, waterlords, tenants or sharecroppers who are entitled to a share in the corn crop available for marketing during the Class Period.



In re Syngenta Lawsuits Dividing the Pie: Allocation of The Settlement Funds

- Subclass 1 (Producers who did not purchase Viptera or Duracade): All Settlement Funds not allocated to the other groups will be allocated to members of Subclass 1.
- <u>Subclass 2</u> (<u>Producers who purchased Viptera or Duracade</u>): (The total amount of <u>Settlement Funds</u> available to Subclass 2 is capped at \$22.6 million and the average per-bushel recovery for Subclass 2 members shall not exceed the average per-bushel recovery for Subclass 1 members.
- <u>Subclass 3 (Grain Handling Facilities)</u>: The total amount of Settlement Funds available to Subclass 3 is capped at \$29.9 million.
- <u>Subclass 4 (Ethanol Facilities)</u>: The total amount of Settlement Funds available to Subclass 3 is capped at \$19.5 million.



In re Syngenta Lawsuits Settlement Claim Forms

- Claims are required to participate. In order to receive a portion the Settlement Funds, online or mail submissions of claims forms is required.
- Calculation of Compensable Recovery Quantity. Claim Forms authorize USDA to provide Producer FSA 578 data, or, if unavailable, RMA data, in order to calculate Compensable Recovery Quantity. If acreage not reported to FSA, information can be supplied.
- Separate claims form required for each interest owner.
- <u>Different forms for Producers, Grain Handling Facilities and</u>
 <u>Ethanol Facilities.</u>






In re Syngenta Lawsuits Settlement Deadlines

- Deadline to Object or Opt Out: August 10, 2018
- Deadline to File Claims: October 12, 2018
- Final Approval Hearing: November 15, 2018
- Payment: Later of April 1, 2019 or 30 days after Final Approval Order






Filing a Claim Online

To begin the process, scroll down on the initial page and click "Click Here to File a Claim."








Filing a Claim Online

Filing your claim online is the quickest and most efficient way to submit a claim.








Filing a Claim by Mail






Filing a Claim by Mail

Simply click on the appropriate form and print!








Filing a Claim by Mail
